Outdoor Flash Mob Performance – Created with 50 students from Blackpool & Fylde College for the Lightpool festival held in Blackpool. We worked with an international DJ and had 50 young people performing in silver bomber jackets and glow sticks outside Blackpool Tower!

- Community

- Youth Dance

Our Community & Youth Dance programmes are primarily funded through participant fees, fundraising and grant funding.

Through our Education programme Schools and Education Providers will buy in our delivery of In-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Dance, bespoke Schemes of Work and other educational resources.

Alongside that, we have a range of merchandise that generates additional income through sales.
